The talking dog ("Hey Lindsey, I wish you didn't smoke weed") and the melted-into-the-couch girl ("This is the way it's been since she started smoking pot") were instant classics.





MYTH BUSTING

In New York State, medical cannabis is legal with physician approval but I have not applied for such a card and therefore, I do not smoke or use it. But I do believe in the healing power of plants and I fundamentally believe that when a natural substance can be used to heal, it should always take precedence over its chemical cousin. A number of years ago, I had to fill a prescription regularly for a family member and found myself at the local pharmacy almost every other day. The pharmacists' most challenging customers were the individuals looking to refill opioid prescriptions. Their suffering was real and it was heartbreaking. As I waited and I watched, I began to change my point of view. I had always accepted the myth of cannabis. I accepted without question that it was a gateway drug. Oh, sure, there were exceptions. A close family member smoked cannabis most of his life and became a very successful businessman but still, the myth lingered.

But seeing those suffering at the pharmacy changed me. I began to consider the possibility that I had been raised on a myth. As I continued to confront the myth, I learned that even the term marijuana was intentionally used to create the fear of something foreign and nefarious. Connecting cannabis to Mexicans was just racist and distracting. As a child in the Seventies, there was no such concern about alcohol. Alcohol was viewed as an acceptable rite of passage. Universities regularly had keg parties on the first day of college for freshmen and every college had a campus pub. Alcohol was part of college life, even if it increased sexual assaults on campus or violence or drunk driving.

Today, the majority of Americans support the legalization of marijuana and believe that the criminalization of marijuana has disproportionately impacted people of color (who do not smoke more than their white counterparts) and prevented people with serious medical ailments access to a plant that may alleviate their suffering and even possibly eradicate

their symptoms. For me, I learned that just because words are repeated will not make them accurate and just because laws are created justice will not necessarily follow. When I read of a child with severe epilepsy unable to function being denied the very medicine that has the power to reduce the number of seizures, I am saddened beyond words. When I think of the cancer patient experiencing loss of appetite from chemotherapy denied cannabis in states that do not allow medical marijuana, I am horrified. When I think of veterans denied marijuana to alleviate symptoms of post-traumatic stress disorder, I am astounded. These same individuals are freely prescribed heavier drugs with greater side effects in the name of healing. Heal the patient. Do not place profits above healing or agendas above health or greed above well-being.

The myth of cannabis has increased opioid addiction, prevented healing for the suffering, and unnecessarily filled our jails. When fiction dictates law, law is without justice. Let the facts stand. Yes, let cannabis be on trial and let the people decide. A national referendum on the legalization of cannabis may be the one vote that unites us all. 

UNPREDICTABLE HICCUPS

THE BRAVE NEW WORLD OF LEGAL CANNABIS IS THE ONE WE'VE BEEN DREAMING OF AND FIGHTING FOR. YET SOME UNEXPECTED ISSUES ARE TAINTING OUR UTOPIAN DREAMS. *BY MIKE DIPAOLA*

SO MUCH GOOD has come from legalization, of course. But within the tangled webs of rules and regulations spun by the various local jurisdictions around the United States, there are emerging unexpected consequences, presenting a challenge for policymakers and stakeholders.

One consequence is that small businesses, whether they're grow operations, retail shops or anything in between, are being edged out by bigger players. Small farms in Washington, for example, which exalted in new opportunities when cannabis became legal, are finding it difficult to compete with the big boys, which are better suited to shoulder the burdens of regulations (and their attendant taxes and fees) and survive through periods of very low wholesale prices.

As a representative snapshot of this phenomenon, look at the October 2017 numbers as documented by the *Stranger*: The state's largest weed producer, Northwest Cannabis Solutions, sold more product (\$2.647 million) than the rest of the state's 500 smallest farms combined (\$2.638 million).

Granted, the consolidation of economic

completely unexpected. It's inevitable in an emerging industry that monopolies will form and, without oversight, overwhelm their smaller competitors. Capitalism gonna capitalize, after all.

But even bigger players can run into problems in the nascent industry. Consider the case of Stephanie Smith, who claims to be California's largest landlord of marijuana businesses. She is currently

suing the city of San Bernardino for a new ordinance that she alleges can create monopolies and prevent her from renting property to growers and other cannabusinesses.

The edibles industry as a whole in the Golden State is consolidating-that is, smaller players are being nudged out-as full legalization takes effect, which is not what pot reformers had in mind. In 2016, the state's share of the edibles market topped \$180 million in sales, according to a report in GreenState by High Times's own edibles maven Elise McDonough, but today there are only 28 licensed edibles companies. Small and mediumsize cannabis-infused food- and drinkmakers are getting shafted by steep rents and onerous new taxes and fees, and by local governments that are banning cannabusinesses outright.

~ Of course, it would be unrealistic to expect a formerly black-market sector to be free of growing pains as it transitions to a legit enterprise. In California, the degree of pain depends on whom you talk to. "Nothing is going smoothly," Jackie McGowan, the director of local licensing and business development for K Street Consulting in Sacramento, said at a recent California Cannabis Industry Association conference. "There's a lack of licensing. A lack of quality product. A lack of labs to test quality product. A lack of distributors that are following the rules. And then a lack of a retail point of sale to get product to the customer."

The recently launched medical-pot program in Pennsylvania is certainly popular, as evinced by dispensaries in that state having difficulties keeping up with demand. But lawmakers are concerned that patients' jobs could be at risk, if and when positive drug tests begin challenging the state law that prohibits employers from firing or discriminating against patients—a conflict that will almost certainly get its day in court.

Ohio is facing the very same issue. Its medical-pot regime will officially begin

on September 8, but many of the state's largest employers have not yet formulated policy to handle employees who might test positive for legal cannabis use. These uncertainties might have been avoided with more thorough planning, but such is the nature of a brand-new industry.

The adult-use era begins in Massachusetts this summer, even though there is somewhat of a logjam of applicants awaiting permits to go into business. Oddly enough, smaller growers might have an advantage here, since grow sites of 10,000 square feet or more of canopy are allowed lighting of only up to 36 watts per square foot, while the little guys can burn as much as 50 watts per square foot. Some observers say big grows will have no choice but to use LED lighting, which is more energy-efficient but requires more money up front (and may not produce the best flowers).

It is worth mentioning here that not

all claims of unintended consequences are really consequences at all. It has become fashionable in certain retrograde circles to claim that legal pot has brought with it rises in crime, homelessness, automobile accidents, teenage consumption and so on—but none of that is true, the result of cherry-picked or faulty information being exploited by prohibitionist scolds. Perhaps *that* consequence was easily predicted.

Unexpected outcomes are unpredictable, hence the term, but many of the issues noted here could be alleviated, if not avoided entirely, if federal laws jibed with those of local governments. Declassifying cannabis as a Schedule I drug is key to meaningful reforms, but until then, cities and states grappling with the rise of legal weed should be learning from the early mistakes of pioneer jurisdictions. The good news is that these problems are not insurmountable and that we can learn from them, and grow. *****

AMERICAN LEGION Chartered by Congress in 1919 as an organization focusing on service to veterans, the American Legion has evolved into one of the most influential nonprofit groups in the United States. The American Legion's national executive committee passed two medicalmarijuana-related resolutions in 2016 and 2017. One calls on the DEA to license privately funded medical-marijuana research in the US: the other calls on the Department of Veterans Affairs to allow medical providers to discuss the use of marijuana for medicinal purposes with vets, and to recommend it where legal.



SILVER HAIRED

The Silver Haired Legislature advocates for seniors in several states across the country. All members are volunteers who serve without pay. Among the five priorities set this year by Missouri's SHL is the legalization of medical marijuana in 2018. Walt Bittle, the SHL's senate president pro tem, says that "to not provide one of the best medicines in the world is cruel and unusual punishment!" Bittle says that legalized medical marijuana should be "prescription-based only" and emphasizes that Big Pharma should not be in control.



SILVER TOUR The Florida-based Silver Tour is an education and advocacy group founded by Robert Platshorn, the former cannabis smuggler known as Black Tuna. After serving 29 years of a 65-year federal prison sentence, Platshorn founded the Silver Tour to educate seniors about medical marijuana. The group provides lectures and uses billboards, social media, and radio and TV advertising to spread the word that pot can benefit seniors. The Silver Tour is also working to assist the state in developing infrastructure to support recently passed pot legislation.



SUE TAYLOR


Sue Taylor is dedicated to educating and advocating for the health and well-being of senior citizens. Taylor is certified to teach California health-care providers about medical cannabis, and she serves on Alameda County's Advisory Commission on Aging. She also travels the country, speaking to local officials and hosting seminars. This summer, Taylor will open the iCANN Health Center, a medical dispensary in Berkeley designed with the elderly in mind-a place where seniors can get advice about pot from their peers.

JAVA JIVE

Drink a lot of coffee? If so, you may be messing with your endocannabinoid system. According to a new study published in the Journal of Internal Medicine, something in coffee can make blood metabolites involved in the endo system drop off. Put another way, coffee suppresses the same endocannabinoid chemicals that cannabis consumption boosts, says Marilyn Cornelis, assistant professor of preventive medicine at Northwestern University Feinberg School of Medicine, who led the study. The researchers asked 47 Finnish adults. habitual coffee drinkers all, to abstain from the joe for a month, then start downing four cups a day for one month, then eight cups per day the following month. It's unclear what the coffee-cannabinoid connection means for coffee, cheeba and human health. "We hope that this will be hypothesis-generating," Cornelis said, which is researcher-speak for "more study necessary." Something to think about when we wake, bake and sip.

PATIENT PERIL

As the newly launched medical-cannabis program takes shape in Pennsylvania, news now comes of an unintended consequence: the risk that patients could lose their jobs if they test positive for pot. At a recent Philadelphia City Council fact-finding meeting, a panel of lawyers, medical professionals and other stakeholders discussed the precarious position patients could be put in under the new regulations. Although Pennsylvania law prohibits employers from firing or discriminating against patients, it also states that "Employers may prohibit patients who are employees from performing any task which the employer deems life-threatening to the employee or other employees while under the influence of marijuana." No one knows if that law will stand up in court, but we'll probably find out soon enough. The medicalcannabis program is only weeks old and dispensaries are already running out of product.

INSIDE THE WIDE WORLD OF WEED

MOM'S HOLDING

Actor Charlize Theron was once a dedicated stoner—"Yes, oh God yes, I was a wakeand-baker for most of my life," she told *E! News* recently. "Then," as she explained to Jimmy Kimmel, "my chemistry just changed one day and I found myself frozen in front of my fridge for like eight hours." Recently, though, she's back on the stuff, largely to help with her insomnia, a condition she shares with her mother. Theron shared a charming anecdote with Kimmel about the time her mom, Gerda Maritz, scored some edibles for her. "She was like, 'So I got some blueberry-covered chocolate ones, but if you want it faster-acting, you should go for the mints. Those you suck, and it works faster." Theron was plugging her recent film, *Gringo*, a darkish comedy about medical-cannabis shenanigans in Mexico City. "Your mom," Kimmel enthused. "She'll score you weed. It's really... what a woman."







new acres approved in the state this year. "Hemp has played a foundational role in Kentucky's agricultural heritage, and I believe that it can be an important part of our future," McConnell enthused at the announcement. Since the 2014 federal farm bill allowed states to designate hemp projects for research, some 19 states have started growing in limited, strictly controlled amounts. "It's now time to take the final step and make this a legal crop," McConnell said. If the tentatively titled Hemp Farming Act of 2018 becomes law, the plant's renaissance will be on its way.


STAY AND HAVE A SPLIFF

California, the nation's cultural trendsetter, permits marijuana smoking at the point of purchase, so long as the retailer has a specially designed lounge. So far, this Amsterdam-like convenience is available at only a select few establishments in San Francisco. The Barbary Coast Collective on Mission Street is gaining traction as a one-stop shop for flowers and dabs, with a comfy lounge in which to enjoy them responsibly. The director of the city's Office of Cannabis (a.k.a. the marijuana czar), Nicole Elliot, says new permits will be issued once certain regulations are worked out. City health officials need to safeguard workers from secondhand smoke and protect neighbors from smelling the dank. Elsewhere in the Golden State, West Hollywood plans to issue up to eight lounge licenses and Alameda a couple more; Oakland and South Lake Tahoe will each have one lounge. Sacramento, Los Angeles and other cities have not authorized any lounges.


GOOD BOOK, BAD IDEA

A Nevada, Missouri, woman did what a lot of people in the Bible Belt do: She delivered the Good Book to a prisoner in jail. Unlike most Bibles given to the incarcerated, however, this one was packed with weed and methamphetamines, the drugs crammed into the book's binding. Ashley Despain was charged with delivery or possession of a controlled substance to the Vernon County Jail, a felony, the Kansas City Star reported. Despain was arrested in the jail's parking lot, along with the passenger in her car who had an outstanding warrant. "If you show up at the sheriff's office with drugs, you shouldn't be surprised when you get arrested," Sheriff Jason Mosher said. "Usually [a Bible] is something you bring to help somebody through situations," the sheriff added. "That's probably the wrong kind of helpputting drugs in it." Despain's bond was set at \$5,000.



Former NFL running back Ricky Williams was known for gaining yards and failing drug tests (four of them over the course of his career), but today he is leveraging his longtime pot advocacy into a vocation as a healer. With the launch of Real Wellness by Ricky Williams, the 1998 Heisman Trophy winner is bringing out a line of salves, tinctures and vape cartridges—including one called Ricky's Choice—that are geared toward healing, many containing therapeutic extracts like arnica, lavender and turmeric. "Surprisingly enough, our research found that the main demographic coming into the [cannabis] market are women ages 35 to 60," Williams told the *SunSentinel*. "Cannabis coming on the scene is a reemerging of herbalism back into our culture." For now, the RW line can be found in dispensaries in San Diego, Los Angeles and the greater Orange County area. Very soon the products will be available online at *rw.life*.



GHOST-TOWN BLUES

Last summer, when the weedtech company American Green purchased the entire town of Nipton, California, with a plan to turn the desert dot on the map into a cannabis destination, some wondered whether the pennystock company had enough capital to make it work. *New Cannabis Ventures* warned that "Investors should be extremely cautious, as

the company, which doesn't file with the SEC, doesn't have the financial capacity to buy the town or develop the project." Such doubts were warranted, as the company has sold off its Nipton holdings for \$7.73 million to Delta International Oil and Gas Inc. (\$3.75 million of which assumes American Green's debt), with a provision that American Green can develop the town for the next five to 10 years. The transfer of holdings will purportedly give American Green the financial wherewithal it needs to "focus on implementing the revenue-generating components of Nipton," according to company chairman David Gwyther. *New Cannabis Ventures* remains skeptical, advising investors to "steer clear of the company."


similar experiences. The baked duo's stoner classic was the first feature-length comedy from a major



Hollywood studio made explicitly by, for and about those who smoke pot. As we tentatively celebrate long-overdue legal sanity concerning cannabis, the *Up in Smoke* 40th-anniversary collector's editions serve as tribute to those who've worked for years to combat the Drug War's scaremongering by using humor to remind us that... it's only grass, maaaan!

The editions arrive in three versions: from Paramount Home Media Distribution, a DVD or Blu-ray/DVD combo, and from Rhino (*rhino.com*) an *Up in Smoke 40th Anniversary Deluxe Collector's Edition* that features the Blu-ray and a CD and an LP of the soundtrack, plus a seven-inch picture disc, booklet, poster and oversize rolling papers for the kind of bomber Chong offers Cheech when the duo first meet.

The film is a time capsule of 1970s Los Angeles. Scenes of LA's car culture, ethnic diversity and early punk rockers add realism, while memorable characters like Vietnam vet Strawberry, the Ajax lady and arch-narc Sgt. Stedenko capture period archetypes. But the film works simply because Cheech & Chong make us laugh—even 40 years later. *Michael Simmons*



ROLLING PAPERBACKS

Among the fallacious arguments that drug warriors used to maintain reefer madness were that cannabis causes a physical addiction akin to narcotics and that smoking pot is a "gateway" to harder drugs. Not surprisingly, many Americans received their drug educations from massmarket paperback books—a cheap, popular format that used the same hysteria to sell books that politicians used to pass laws.

A new coffee-table anthology called *Girl Gangs, Biker Boys, and Real Cool Cats: Pulp Fiction and Youth Culture, 1950 to 1980* (*pmpress.org*) collects the covers of these paperbacks, as well as their publishing histories and plot breakdowns. The milieus of these tawdry tomes reflected the evolving countercultures of the midto-late 20th century: juvenile delinquents, beatniks, hippies, ghetto kids, groupies, punk rockers and so on. Then as now, sex meant sales, so the covers often featured models wearing minimal (if any) clothing.

Cannabis-themed tomes include Sex, Pot and Acid; The Young Lawyers Test Case; Death of a Hippie; at least two called Marijuana Girl ("She traded her body for drugs—and kicks!"); and one that doesn't beat around the bud, simply titled Stoned. Our current attorney general, Jeff Sessions, apparently used his time at law school reading The Grass Pipe, in which the teenage protagonists are scared straight after a "marijuana trip."

Between the unintentional comedy of bargain-basement hacks and the comehither-and-read-me covers, this collection of a long-gone low-brow art form expresses attitudes that were absurd even in their day. 



successful album. When Green eventually returned, things had

changed. "It was a good opportunity for him to see if he wanted to be a part of the band," Brock says. "When he got back, he was getting super-high all the time. He had normal-people weedsmoking abilities at that point. It was super-weird, because he'd be [drumming] super-slow or super-fast. It was never right. Then he got super-good at weed smoking, if that's a thing-and I think it is," Brock continues.

"Master-expert level is where he is now. He can walk on tight ropes and do trigonometry with it and shit. He's always Jeremiah. I love the guy. Even when he was crazier than a shit-house rat, I had patience for it. His crazy was kind of interesting."

Brock occasionally smokes with Green and fellow band member Tom Peloso-whom he calls "some Cheech-and-Chong motherfuckers"-but for the most part leaves the toking to them.

"I smoke regularly," Green explains. "After taking the antidepressants, I started to realize cannabis was probably the better way to go. I've smoked for so long I don't really get high anymore. I just sort of smoke on a low level."

Modest Mouse are still touring in support of their latest project, Strangers to Ourselves, and despite becoming a new father, Green is looking forward to being on the road.

"Marijuana helps the time go faster on tour," he says. "I feel like I maybe smoke a little more on tour. It's like cheap therapy."

On the other hand, Brock, who is also a new father, has his reservations.

"I got a newborn daughter and I'm not looking forward to not being around her for five months," Brock admits. "It bums me the fuck out. I really like her. Supposedly-and this will change because all medical info from Western civilization changes every four years-the first six months is when they develop their personality, and I am terrific, so I'd like her to have some of me." 🖗

JEREMIAH GREEN IS in Issaguah. Washington, trying to find a place to smoke a spliff outside of his grandma's house. He's momentarily bothered by a passerby, but he goes about his business like it's any other day. The Modest Mouse drummer has been smoking cannabis for years to alleviate his depression, a condition that led to his temporary exit from the band he and front man Isaac Brock established over 20 years ago.

"I went on antidepressants, and I got all manic and weird," Green explains. "I just blew up one day. I was acting hella weird. I ended up in the hospital for six hours and realized pretty quick I didn't want to be there."

But quitting the band wasn't something Green meant to do. Modest Mouse was still basking in the critical acclaim of 2000's The Moon & Antarctica and had its sights firmly set on a promisina future.

"It basically took me a long time to call them because I was embarrassed," Green confesses. "All of a sudden all of that happened, and within a week or so, I was off antidepressants and I figured out what the fuck had gone on. I got back to normal and was like, 'Holy shit, I ruined my whole life basically.' [Laughs] I sat around depressed for like a year. I didn't do shit. Luckily, those guys were cool and got me back in the band."

During Green's hiatus, Benjamin Weikel kept his seat warm and Modest Mouse powered through with 2004's Good News for People Who Love Bad News, the band's most commercially

THE SWORD ARE REACHING FOR A NEW KIND OF BLADE–BUT DON'T ASK THEM TO DROP THEIR BLUNTS. *BY POLLY WATSON*

"DON'T GET TOO Comfortable" is the title of a track appearing halfway through the Sword's sixth full-length studio album, *Used Future*, and though the song itself is a hazy, riff-laden jam in which bandleader J.D. Cronise muses about the dystopian future of our increasingly less green planet, it could also be a warning to the group's longtime fans that this record represents another step forward in the band's march away from metal.

It's been a dozen years since the Sword rode in on the doomcold winds of *Age of Winters*, the debut album that landed their music in *Guitar Hero*, their faces on the covers of numerous metal magazines, and the band, eventually, in arenas, heating up the pit for thrash pioneers Metallica. Since then, the Sword have evolved from sci-fi-channeling metalians to hard'n'heavy rockers of the order that walked the earth nearly half a century ago—or, given the speed at which popular culture now metamorphoses, eons ago.

In short, the boys of the nameless decade are now the men of the bleak present, and they no longer have to look to Philip K. Dick to extract—for inspiration and for lyrical content—horrors of the kind now looming on our event horizon. Lyrically, their latest release touches on mortality, loneliness and earth's expanding desertscape, all in language as colorful and evocative as that of their previous efforts. Musically, it marries blown-out analog synths worthy of John Carpenter or Tangerine Dream with massive Led Zeppelin riffs and scorching, ZZ Top-style licks to yield boulder-heavy hard rockers rich with flange and distortion, interspersed with dreamier, fuzztoned explorations.



"We finally sound like ourselves," enthuses guitarist Kyle Shutt, speaking with High Times on the phone from Austin, the band's hometown, where they are about to kick off the first leg of a three-month US tour. "Like the best rock band!" He credits, in part, producer Tucker Martine, known largely for his work with indie darlings Decemberists and My Morning Jacket. With Martine, the band experimented with various instrumentation and forswore the digital whenever possible, in favor of the analog.

The band recorded in a Portland, OR, warehouse, stepping outside to toke, so as not to damage the delicate recording gear. All members of the Sword smoke weed. Shutt prefers to roll his own joints, oldschool style. "Just flowers and papers," he says, waving away the bells and whistles of modern technology. He draws the line at dabbing: "Seven grams of THC in one hit—no thanks. That's a young man's game!"

Though weed figures in both the band's lyrics and its videos (check out the Nintendo-style vid for Used Future's title track), the band had a unique opportunity to make their love of the plant public. "We played in Denver the night weed was legalized in Colorado," Shutt recalls. "It was New Year's Eve. We went offstage" and "came out holding bongs and then hit them at the same time. The crowd went totally insane. Probably the biggest response we've ever gotten!" *****

PLAIN ABOUT THE STRAIN

To date, the Sword have a beer, a hot sauce and a BMX bike named after them; when *High Times* asks Shutt if the band would consider lending their moniker to a strain of weed, his reply is unequivocal. "Yes," he says spiritedly. Fans who grow, take note!

ONCE MORE UNTO THE BREACH THE FIFTH INSTALLMENT OF THE FAR CRY FRANCHISE MANAGES TO SATISFY

WHEN BOOTING UP *Far Cry 5*, everything about it feels different from its predecessors. Gone are the tropical islands, maniacal warlords and one-manarmy tropes, replaced with rural Montana, deceptively charming (but still maniacal) Christian cultists and more recruitable comrades than your enemies can handle.

First things first: Montana is a gorgeous location to explore, full of secrets to discover (sometimes too many; *Far Cry 5* continues the Ubisoft tradition of overwhelming the already gigantic map) and cultists to chase down. The location and plot—your character is trying to defeat a deranged false prophet building a militia to create his own sovereign state—manage to feel fresh and timely,

but without being political. There's a huge selection of customizable weapons to play around with, and you'll get plenty of experience with them thanks to the borderline-annoying number of cultists and aggressively rabid animals walking about. Here's the thing about *Far*

Cry 5: It's the culmination of a series of pretty great games. A fresh coat of paint and some plastic surgery has been applied to everything, so it thrills and shines and excites (we can *finally* ride around in helicopters) just like the other games in the *Far Cry* series. But underneath all the makeup, there's not really a whole lot new here. However, at this point, we already know exactly what we want and crave from this title—and *Far Cry 5* delivers.

At the end of the day, *Far Cry 5* is a fantastic game, no matter how familiar it feels. The gunplay is tight, the plot is engrossing, the wide-open world is a joy to explore and the new *Far Cry Arcade*—where users can create custom levels and share them with the world—ensures new content will continue to flow. *Far Cry 6* will need to be a major reinvention if the series wants to remain relevant, but for now, *Far Cry 5* is everything you'd expected and more. *Casey Holday*





T'S BEEN A persistent urban myth among some cannabis advocates that the Declaration of Independence and its 56 signatures were written on hemp paper. Of course, that theory has been thoroughly debunked by researchers at Monticello (Thomas Jefferson's estate), the Library of Congress and the National Archives. The final document signed by the founding fathers at the Continental Congress in 1776 was engrossed on parchment made from animal skin. The original

rough draft, written by Jefferson and kept among the Jefferson Papers collection at the Library of Congress, has watermarks indicating it to be Dutch-made paper consisting of flax or linen rags.

Nevertheless, some 242 years later, hemp is revolutionary in its own way. As recently noted in our December 2017 column ("Is This Finally the Big Moment for Hemp?"), hemp is enjoying an international renaissance. Both extremely versatile and ecologically friendly to produce, hemp is being grown and used worldwide in the development of an ever-expanding array of commercial applications including hemp-based cannabidiol (CBD) and terpenoid oils, tinctures, foods, dietary supplements, nutraceuticals, body-care products, textiles, construction materials, applied materials and industrial products.

Despite a long, rich history in America (preceding the establishment of the United States itself) and being touted for its benefits as recently as World War II ("Hemp for Victory!" was a rallying slogan to defeat the Axis), for the past half-century industrial hemp has suffered prohibited federal classification because of its kinship to cannabis. The plants are related, but while marijuana remains banned under the federal Controlled Substances Act due to the psychoactive properties of THC, hemp typically contains less than 0.3 percent of it, whereas medical and adult-use



cannabis commonly features between 5 and 25 percent THC.

New Frontier Data is tracking some detailed prospective market trajectories, and recently acquired the Hemp Business Journal to bolster resources for leading data and market intelligence in the industry. As Sean Murphy, New Frontier Data's director of hemp analytics, notes, "There is continued tension in the industry, with actions being taken by and between hemp and marijuana players in states like Oregon. There's also industry love happening with an increase of M&A [mergers and acquisitions] deals in Canada being driven by Canadian LPs [licensed producers], Big Tobacco, and Big Pharmaceuticals placing bets and positioning their interests in the market."

As detailed in the Hemp Business Journal's "CBD Report 2018," the total CBD market in the United States grew at a rate of 40 percent in 2017 and is projected to reach \$1.2 billion in sales by 2020, and nearly \$2 billion by 2022. In 2017, \$190 million of those sales came from hemp-based sources, compared to \$177 million from adult-use and medical cannabis sources. Given the potential profits involved, it is no surprise to learn of some fissures opening among interested players within the reform movement.

Some US cannabis operators are already resenting how hemp products are increasingly battling for retail shelf space in dispensaries.



Hemp is cultivated by the acre on farms, whereas cannabis is grown by the square foot in greenhouses or indoor-cultivation facilities, giving hemp growers an economic advantage to scale and dominate supply chains for CBD products.

Hemp acreage in the United States keeps expanding, if unevenly. While Oregon recorded nearly 3,500 cultivated hemp acres in 2017, its neighbor Washington cultivated about 175

acres-a 20-to-one difference.

With legalized hemp programs in 34 states, protectionist legislation is being proposed in several legislatures to shield the legal cannabis market from hempbased competition.

Canada's hemp production continues to set the pace for the fledgling US market. Health Canada reported 138,000 acres licensed for cultivation in 2017, and the Hemp Business Journal estimates that 110,000 acres were under cultivation (actual cultivation data is yet to be verified by Health Canada or the Canadian Hemp Trade Alliance).

As Canadian hemp can now be used only to yield seeds and fiber (leaving leaves and flower unutilized), global competitors from China, Switzerland and other European Union nations are buying whole plants for expansive processing.

Even so, Canadian LPs are quickly positioning themselves to penetrate the global CBD market by acquiring hemp companies in preparation of new cannabis laws this summer. The spike in M&A activity among Canadian LPs and small hemp cultivators and extractors is a clear sign of Canadian LPs moving quickly into the CBD market upon passage of the new legislation.

Assuming such skirmishing to be indicative of future market activity, projections for the production, use and sales of low-THC products will remain sky-high. 💥



THE GAME HAS CHANCED

Article by Jeremy Deichen

Growing Exposed, a new video series produced by Jeremy Deichen, has been coined "the MTV Cribs of the marijuana industry" for its exclusive look into the once underground world of North America's gardens. Aside from revealing secrets of industry leaders, David Robinson, author of The Growers' Handbook, lends his expertise to a segment called Teachings of the Garden Sage. You can check out gardens, like the ones that make British Columbia's Kootenay region the Mecca of B.C. bud, on the latest episodes at growingexposed.com.

When Bryan Johnston began growing cannabis, it was the early '90s. He was using 1000 watt bulbs hung from the ceiling commonly referred to as "Donkey Dick" lights. During this period, British Columbia was becoming infamous for the highest quality bud on the planet and people were calling the province's crops "Beaster". A lot has changed in the 25 years since – including his setup and the base plant food he uses, thanks to Green Planet Nutrients.

A n environmentally conscious guy, Bryan says he remembers, back in the day running those 1000 kilowatt bare bulbs. Today, his indoor garden uses a smaller wattage but yields dramatically more per watt than ever before.


"Everything has changed. The game has changed,"

he says. "I'm running doubled-ended P.L. lighting with four Spectrum King 600-watt LED lights and doing a massive cross spectrum of light, running four 315-watt P.L. ceramic metal halides. So I'm totaling just under 4,700 watts and yielding on average, two pounds or more for every 1,000 watts of light." The most recent change to Bryan's garden wasn't in setup though, but to a new base plant food. Manufactured by Green Planet Nutrients, Dual Fuel is a highly concentrated, two-part formula that provides all the energy plants need without the need for calcium or magnesium additives. It's known for an easy application process which leaves less room for error.

Ve tried different brands but I've been using Green Planet's Hydro Fuel and got fantastic results, so when I went to my local grow shop and got some samples of Dual Fuel about two years ago, it wasn't a stretch to give it a try," Bryan says. "But on some level, any type of switch is a leap of faith as a grower. 3 SIMPLE TECHNIONES AND TIPS TO MAXMIZE INDOOR PLANT HELDS

WITH MORE THAN HALF the states in the US now allowing for either medical or recreational marijuana use, there are more cannabis cultivators than ever. Many growers are now either legally experimenting in their own home gardens, working in licensed cultivation facilities, or still bucking the system in prohibitionist states and raising clandestine crops of their own.

The result is that in both the legal and underground black markets, marijuana supply has finally exceeded demand in this county. And so in the spirit of continuing that trend—and in celebration of finally overgrowing our own backwardthinking federal government—here are the three most effective techniques for increasing plant yields and potency. Happy growing!

INCREASE ROOT MASS

Plant containers are often an afterthought for indoor growers, but their importance should not be overlooked for several reasons. Containers or plant pots are important because they house, nurture and protect perhaps the most important part of the plant—the root structure.

Root growth and health are essential elements to the overall success of a plant, as a healthy and well-developed root system is directly proportional to a plant's final size and yield. Plants typically can only grow as wide as their root structure can extend. The larger the root zone, the more the roots can extend and the larger the plant can grow above surface.

Additionally, containers provide other integral advantages for the root structure, such as water retention and drainage,


both of which are important factors for healthy plant development. Containers must strike an important balance between retaining moisture long enough for roots to absorb the hydration needed for biological processes and allowing for ample drainage so that the roots do not sit long in unabsorbed water. Roots that sit too long in stagnant water can develop root rot and attract pests and disease. Healthy roots are long and bright white, with little hairlike bristles that attract and absorb water and minerals.

Obviously, the larger the plant container, the larger the root mass will become and thus the overall size of the plant as well. Therefore, indoor growers should carefully consider the space available in their indoor gardens and choose the appropriate containers to grow their plants to the desired size. Plant containers come in every size, shape and material imaginable. Containers that offer maximum "breathability" are most preferable, as they allow air to better permeate the root zone. It is important for indoor growers to understand that roots breathe in oxygen (O_2) while the rest of the plant above the surface breathes in carbon dioxide (CO_2) through its leaves.

Because it's difficult to get airflow in and around the root zone, newer developments in containers offer growers more advantages in providing air to the roots. Hardy fabric bags have become one of the most popular choices for indoor cultivators, as these "pots" are made of a strong material that can hold a lot of weight yet still allow air to enter the medium through the sides and bottom. These fabric bags range in sizes containing from one gallon to over 200 gallons of your chosen medium and can be used both indoors and outdoors.





SMART PRUNING TECHNIQUES

Pruning is both an art and a science. It can be done for both aesthetic reasons and to aid in plant development. The latter will be our focus here. A grower's understanding of plant botany and physiology is essential when pruning a plant, because a plant's natural response to the removal of growth is the primary purpose for deploying such techniques.

Pruning is often done in conjunction with plant training (which will be discussed in the following section) in order to maximize the effects pruning has on a plant's growth and yield. Because pruning invigorates both regrowth and new growth, it is an excellent way to increase size and add more budding sites for flowers to our cannabis plants.

Perhaps the most important concept to understand when it comes to pruning is "apical dominance." Apical dominance resides in the terminal shoot, or the top center bud (i.e., the main stem), and it directs plant growth for the top two-thirds of the plant. While the apical shoot is dominant, lateral branch growth is suppressed. Interrupting apical dominance stimulates new growth, as plant growth hormones are redirected to side shoots. With proper training, this results in several new top colas, thereby greatly increasing yield. This is the exact science behind how "topping" cannabis plants results in larger yields (see the "Top 3 Pruning Methods" sidebar for more details on how to top plants).


When it comes to pruning, timing is an important consideration—especially for cannabis plants, which flower seasonally. In nature, cannabis plants bear their fruit late in the year, during the late-summer and autumn months. Flowering occurs on plant growth that occurred much earlier in the year; therefore, pruning should take place early in the plant's life cycle. The same principles apply for indoor gardens, where the life cycle of the plants typically ranges from three to four months, depending on how long they remain in the vegetative phase.

Once seedlings or young clones have established strong root systems and have been transplanted into their permanent containers where they will be flowering, growers can start to prune plants in preparation for increasing yields. Ideally, this should be done about two weeks into the plant's vegetative stage, leaving at least another month of vegetative time for the plant to grow and develop the new and additional shoots that will result from the pruning.

TOP 3 PRUNING METHODS

TOPPING/PINCHING OFF

Topping, or pinching off, refers to the method that addresses apical dominance, discussed earlier. To "top" a plant is to remove its top terminal shoot. This shoot is usually directly linked to, if not the same as, the main stalk of the plant (sometimes it can be an offshoot directly above the main stalk). To remove this shoot, simply run your fingers up the main stem until they are just below the top "bud," which at this point of development will be composed of a couple of smaller leaf sets. These leaves will be barely developed and have light green color. Using pruning shears—or long fingernails if you prefer to pinch—make a cut just below the top bud and above the node (branch site) directly below it. Be sure that the shears are clean and have been properly sterilized. When making the cut, be careful to make a clean slice, leaving no residual leaf matter hanging from the shoot.

FIM TECHNIQUE

The FIM technique is probably the most interesting—and effective pruning technique deployed by growers, and it can be utilized both indoors and outside. Essentially, the FIM technique is the same as the topping technique described above, but with one small change: Instead of cutting the entire top bud off the shoot, growers only trim off about two-thirds of the leafy material at the top, leaving the bottom third intact and looking like a freshly mowed lawn.

In fact, the term "FIM" stands for "Fuck, I missed," which was apparently said when a grower was trying to simply top a plant but made the cut too high. Why the grower left the plant in such a state without correcting the mistake with a lower cut is unknown, but what is known are the resulting effects this mistake had on the plant. Whereas topping a plant generally results in one or possibly two additional sets of lower shoots growing out from below the cut, the FIM technique results in several more shoots appearing below. Sometimes there are 6 to 8 more ensuing shoots, all of which can result in additional top colas with the proper plant training.

SUPER-CROPPING

Super-cropping is a traditional technique developed in the very early days of indoor cannabis cultivation in Holland. The principles and results behind super-cropping are relatively the same as the two techniques discussed above; however, depending on how you look at it, there is either more or less plant mutilation involved.

Super-cropping simply involves the bending and twisting of branches to achieve the same effects as topping or using the FIM technique on a plant, though many growers insist that the bending of branches does not necessarily have to occur only at the top terminal shoot. Instead, the cropping of branches can occur at the lower levels of the plant as well to help encourage more vigorous growth or "bushing." (Note: In truth, the same can be said for topping and the FIM technique, but most growers generally desire more growth at the top of plants in order to create more colas.)

To super-crop a plant, a shoot is bruised, bent and twisted in order to trigger a physiological response within the plant—the release of growth hormones in response to injury. In this scenario, a grower chooses a topside branch to roll between the thumb and index fingers. This will rotate the branch and cause it to pop, or blister, at the point of pressure. The injured branch will become weak (though you should avoid snapping it off altogether or causing it to fall limp). You should attempt to leave the branch bent at a 90-degree angle. When a branch growing vertically is bent and forced to remain horizontal, the interference in apical dominance will cause the shoots on the same axis to become stimulated by growth hormone and grow vertically, thereby creating more top shoots from the same branch.



TRELLISING 101

The pruning and trellising of fruit-bearing plants such as cannabis are almost always done together in order to increase productivity and yield as well as to ease the harvesting process. Simply stated, trellising involves the training of plant limbs to grow in specific directions, while also adding a structural support system for the plant and its fruit.

Trellising can be deployed in many ways. Most commonly, growers tie plant limbs to wires, posts or walls for support. Technically speaking, a trellis system can be any system of latticework that crosses back and forth across a garden, creating multiple points of support for branches and colas.

Bamboo stakes are a common trellis post system. These stakes can be on the periphery of the garden and used to hold horizontal crossbars, or they can lean into the center, resting on one another, to be used as tie points. Sometimes the walls of an indoor garden, or simple wooden frames constructed around the garden, can serve as makeshift trellis systems, from which wires are strung across the garden and used as training and support systems.

Other types of vertical trellises might include cylindrical or cubed latticework for individual plant sites. These types of trellises are generally placed around the entire plant during the early vegetative stage, allowing the plants to develop and grow out through the structure, creating plant "towers." When using this method, the height of the plant is kept short through a series of plant toppings as described previously. With two or three toppings over the course of the veg cycle, the plant will grow numerous lower side shoots that can develop into topside colas. These lateral top shoots are trained to grow out through the trellis and then climb up the latticework by weaving in and out of the tower.

Modern techniques for indoor growers have evolved even further, using prefabricated trellis systems and a little grower ingenuity. An example of this is the ever-popular 4-inch-square netting. Made of plastic, this netting is available in large rolls that can be unrolled easily over young vegetating gardens as a horizontal screen. The netting is usually stretched over gardens in sections and attached at the corners to posts or walls. This technique should be put into place early in a garden's development, usually within the first two weeks of the vegetative phase, allowing for plants to grow upward through the netting. Once large enough, plants can be trained to grow horizontally and then up through a second-or even a third-layer of netting, depending on the finishing height of the plants.


Trellising is especially important in gardens that utilize the pruning techniques outlined in the previous sections of this article. As plants develop and become top-heavy due to the creation of additional top shoots and colas, the plants will not be able to support themselves properly, resulting in them expending energy that would otherwise be used in the production of buds and trichomes. Thus, good trellis systems can go a long way in increasing both the yield and potency of cannabis gardens.

ADVANCED PRUNING & TRELLIS STRATEGY

As discussed, both pruning and trellising not only aid plants in development and growth, but they also reward growers with increased yields and potency.

We know that pruning shoot tips (topping) to interfere with apical dominance in order to encourage lateral branching, pruning to invigorate growth during the vegetative phase and trellising to train plants to grow a certain way are all effective ways to boost plant yields.

However, there are other technical considerations that are made during the course of regular garden maintenance that are geared toward increasing plant yields as well. For example, the standard pruning technique, which entails the removal of dead or necrotic leaves, goes a long way in helping plants increase energy reserves to be used later for flowering. Because while cannabis plants will not expend energy attempting to repair or regenerate leaves, those injured leaves will consume more energy than they produce. Removing them allows the plants to either direct energy to new growth or store energy in the root structure (and stems) as starch to be recalled later during the flowering stage.

Another pruning technique known as "crown thinning" aims to open up

the garden canopy so that there is better light penetration through the plants to their lower branches. When used in conjunction with a trellis system, the top branches can be pulled apart and better separated from each other, thus allowing light to reach the middle and lower levels of the plant. This aids the plants in capturing light energy (photons) to be used during photosynthesis, which is how plants manufacture their food and create energy.

Conversely, "crown raising" is another strategy used by advanced growers, which entails removing the entire bottom third of a plant's branches. The goal here is to redirect more of the plant's energy to its top half, where the colas and larger fruits reside. This

helps pack on overall weight, as the top buds get heavier than the lower "popcorn" buds, which are energy suckers and do little for the marketability of your final product.

grade flowers, may take on the extreme pruning method of cutting off flowering branches entirely to increase the size and potency of the top colas. In this situation, growers will lob off entire branches on the lower two-thirds of the plant at the first signs of flowering in order to direct all energy to the top third of the plant. This will not necessarily increase yields, but it will help to increase both the size and potency of the top colas.

As we've seen, there are some simple yet effective techniques to improve yields for your indoor cannabis crop. By increasing root mass, pruning effectively and utilizing a trellis system, you can stimulate larger yields come harvest time. 🖗







IN 2013, URUGUAY BECAME THE FIRST COUNTRY IN THE WORLD TO LEGALIZE CANNABIS. NOW THAT LEGALIZATION IS FINALLY HITTING ITS STRIDE WITH COMMERCIAL SALES THROUGH PHARMACIES AND HIGH-QUALITY CULTIVATION THROUGH CANNABIS CLUBS, HIGH TIMES INVESTIGATES THE SOUTH AMERICAN NATION'S LEGAL WEED SCENE.

IARRIVE AT 4:19 P.M., one minute early for my underground tour of Uruguay's cannabis culture in the nation's capital, Montevideo. Keepz, a professional grower and one half of Kush Bros. tours, greets me and quickly spins up a *porro*—Spanish slang for a joint.

"This is the front line against the War on Drugs. It was the first country to stand up and say, 'You know what? This isn't working.' We don't believe in the War on Drugs, and we're going to take the first step to say, 'This won't continue'—in our backyard at least," Keepz tells me as we begin the tour by smoking at his grow operation, which provides a variety of blends for one of Uruguay's cannabis clubs.

Although the legalization of cannabis by the Uruguayan government took effect in July 2017, Keepz insists that I not

use his real name. The law strictly forbids the promotion of cannabis, including the promotion of clubs and grow shops. So, even in a country where pharmacies now sell US \$1 government-grown grams, the folks at the forefront of the local marijuana movement can't advertise.

Unfortunately, as a tourist, I can't buy government weed or buds from local cannabis clubs. In fact, there is no legal way for foreigners to purchase cannabis in Uruguay yet. However, if a local decides to share or gift an outsider marijuana, foreigners can legally partake like any Uruguayan citizen.

Here's where my new friend Keepz comes in, gifting me a second *porro* of his special Triple Nova Unicorn blend. We hit the streets walking and light up again. "I don't think it bothers people here," Keepz says as we pass the joint back and forth, winding through bodies along the sidewalk of the principle avenue of Montevideo, Julio de 18. "I think it's become normalized; the way they treat it here is the same as if they were cigarettes."

No one bats an eye as we blaze in public, passing people leaving work in suits, children coming home from school and others smoking their own *porros* nearby.

We arrive at one of the local cannabis clubs that doubles as a head shop; the young owners are already in a circle out front, passing around a joint by the curb without a care. many people die from alcohol each day compared to weed?"

But even with the limitations of the new law, the budtender and the other employees of the shop enjoy the freedom they have as Uruguayan citizens. They show off a homebuilt resin-extraction machine, providing a demonstration that creates fine wax. They fire up rounds on a bong with a torch lighter and I'm encouraged to partake. So I take a rip of the wax and, soon after, we're back on the streets, heading toward another cannabis club.

The next club's owner claims he has the highest-quality marijuana in Uruguay,



There are three ways for Uruguayans over the age of 18 to consume cannabis: one, by registering with the government to buy up to 10 grams a week from 12 pharmacies across the country; two, by growing their own; or three, by becoming a member of a cannabis club like this head shop.

Cannabis clubs exist in several forms, but all you need are 15-45 people and you can create your own nonprofit organization that can dispense up to 40 grams a month to each member.

Still, the budtender at the head shop we visit wishes the laws were a bit more lenient.

"We can't do any publicity for the shop," he tells me. "Like if *High Times* rolls in like this, we can't even let you publish our name. How come alcohol brands can do publicity but not us? How having sourced the best cannabis seeds and strains from around the world. I ask if he's tried the government cannabis.

"It's like the weed I grew the first time I ever grew," he chuckles before insisting it's still better than the skunk brick weed that proliferates in the black market, which is widely trafficked around South America and is known as *paraguayo* for its country of origin, Paraguay.

"But [government pot] is good because people can have something healthy for a really low price," the club owner says. "But also it's not competition for what people grow in the clubs because it doesn't reach high THC levels. [The government's] objective is to take out the brick weed from the streets, and I think they're accomplishing it."

The first batch of cannabis released by the Uruguayan government for sale

in pharmacies contained only 2 percent THC, and later batches still hadn't passed the 10 percent mark by the end of 2017. However, the government has stated its plans to come out with higherpercentage strains in the future.

We leave the club and head to Plaza Independencia in front of the Torre Ejecutiva building, which houses the Uruguayan president's office. Keepz hands me the last *porro* with several half-smoked presents to save for later legal gifts from a friend.

Hazy tours are not the only way to understand Uruguay's unique path to legalization, and perhaps no place is better to learn about it than the Montevideo Cannabis Museum, which opened in December 2016. After two years of preparation, Eduardo Blasina converted his home into the museum after receiving permission from the government. But for Blasina, the museum isn't simply a way for foreigners to learn about Uruguay's path to independence.

"I thought it was important to explain to the Uruguayan citizens that cannabis is a plant, and not necessarily a drug a plant with multiple things to offer to humankind," Blasina says.

The museum is filled with information about the global cannabis experience with several exhibits donated by Amsterdam's Hash, Marihuana, & Hemp Museum.

Blasina wasn't surprised that Uruguay, South America's second-smallest country, became the world's first nation to legalize cannabis across its territory in modern history. He points to the country's long history of social advances, including being one of the first nations in Latin America to legalize divorce and to separate the church from the state.

Uruguay's liberal standing became legendary after the 2010 election of José Mujica. A former guerrilla and member of the left-wing Tupamaros movement, which attempted to overthrow the civil-military government regime that controlled the country at the time, Mujica spent 14 years in prison in the 1970s and '80s. During his five-year presidency, he decriminalized abortion in 2012 and legalized both same-sex marriage and cannabis in 2013.

Mujica, who is known as "Pepe," was widely considered "the world's most humble president." He famously turned down living in the presidential mansion, opting instead to remain in an aging farmhouse that he shares with his wife— Uruguay's current vice president, Lucia Topolansky—on the outskirts of Montevideo. During his presidency, he drove to work each day in his beat-up 1987 Volkswagen Beetle and donated roughly 90 percent of his salary to help provide housing for the poor.

To truly understand the path to legalization in Uruguay, I felt it was imperative to speak with Pepe, but my attempts to contact the government (Mujica is still a sitting senator) went unanswered.

Fortunately, locals provided valuable advice to set up a meeting—just show up at his house. It takes 45 minutes by taxi to arrive, and soon I'm in the Uruguayan countryside. In the distance I see Pepe, and he waves to me. I ask the guard to tell him that I've spent the past four years living in Mexico covering the War on Drugs, and I'd like to talk to him about legalization if he has a moment. Minutes later, Pepe invites me into a shed to chat.

Wearing an old, stain-covered polo shirt, the front pocket ripped and hanging down, the 82-year-old former president engages me and displays the intelligence and charisma that allowed him to push through his monumental legislation.

"For many years, repressive laws have been used to combat drug trafficking, and the real result is that drug trafficking continues and multiplies, so then you have to ask yourself, 'What really has the greatest effect?' And we came to the conclusion that regulating the market is how we could truly combat drug trafficking," Pepe tells me.

A BRIEF INTERVIEW WITH JOSE "PEPE" MUJICA

HT: How did you approach legalization in Uruguay?

We are very aware of what happened in the '30s in the United States, when they banned alcohol. The hiding of alcohol made things much worse. So we started testing with marijuana, to create a regulated market, where we assured the consumer of this. Because if you have it clandestinely, we saw what happened in America, in Mexico, everywhere. In the end, drug trafficking is worse than the drug itself.

Do you think Uruguay will legalize other drugs?

We do not know for now. We must experiment with this [marijuana legalization], continue learning and then maybe try. What happens is that there are



huge repressive apparatuses whose ability to exist is from the repression of drug trafficking, a complete doctrine, a business of an international nature that creates terrible pressure [to fight drugs]. Even the banks are part of this apparatus. They do not want the Drug War to stop, but it's not working either. We believe that this strategy of only fighting drugs by means of repression is failing—in the entire world, it's failing. In Mexico, the farmers are persecuted by the government for doing the only work their families have done for generations, and they live in poverty while the traffickers live lavishly. This is precisely why we, instead of arguing if the drug is good or bad, decided to fight their foundation. The way to fight drug trafficking is to try to break the market, quit using the drug traffickers, ruin the business.

What did you think when pharmacies began selling marijuana?

When we enabled [pharmacies] to sell, queues of consumers appeared. It means that the market is strong. If that market does not function legally, it works clandestinely. People went to the pharmacy with enthusiasm, to the point that the supply was sold-out everywhere.

Beyond smoking, people are interested in other cannabis products.

Certainly, by legalizing it, it legally allows different branches of investigation to exist—other applications of cannabis. Because, after all, we have punished a remarkable plant because it's considered a drug, and therefore we lose all other positive possibilities that exist. Like as fiber, it is great many of the strongest fabrics were made [from] hemp.

It's nearly five years since you finished your presidency. Do you foresee running again in the next election?

No. I am 82 years old. It seems to me that another generation has to come. Yes, I still have political influence. I belong to one party, of the 50 deputies in the house, we have 25. [Political influence] reaches me with that.


"I've never smoked marijuana in my life, and I have no need, but I recognize that there are a lot of people that do. Just personally, I cannot," Mujica explains. "Still, I think it's ridiculous that you're persecuting a kid for smoking a marijuana cigarette."

That type of unnecessary persecution no longer occurs in Uruguay, and Pepe hopes the country can lead by example.

After our conversation [see the sidebar for more of my talk with Pepe], I'm motivated to see more of Uruguay's liberal spirit. While Montevideo is perhaps the most relaxed Latin American capital and the epicenter of the country's cannaplants that grow alongside his house. After showing me his garden, he invites me inside the home he built himself.

"We live here basically without using money. What happens here is you have to have imagination," Cuchi explains as he picks up a piece of plastic that's washed up on the beach. "See this—this isn't trash. Some people think it is; to me, it's a material." The walls of his home are insulated with empty wine boxes and milk cartons; he's painted them with messages like "*Cuidado planeta*"—"take care of the planet."

Cuchi, who's now 49, moved to Cabo Polonio 26 years ago because he "didn't



bis movement, I'd heard about a reputed coastal paradise where Uruguay's unorthodox culture flourishes—Cabo Polonio.

About 150 miles up the coast from Montevideo, a rustic off-the-grid encampment of handmade houses sits on the grassy tip of a windy peninsula. Originally a small fishing center populated by only a few families, Uruguay's alternative culture began squatting in Cabo Polonio in the '80s and never left.

After making the four-hour trip, I see Cabo Polonio's true beauty for the first time. The hamlet of ramshackle homes is surrounded by the beach, except for the rocky tip where hundreds of sea lions lazily pass their days in the shadow of a lighthouse.

While walking around the seaside town, I encounter a crotchety man named Cuchi who's inspecting the marijuana need to use shoes here." He's been working on his house ever since.

Cabo Polonio doesn't have running water, and locals playfully argue over whose well water tastes best. The only electricity is generated by windmills or solar panels, and there are no ATMs or cars and only a handful of restaurants and shops that open during the high season. Although there are roughly 400 houses in Cabo Polonio, it has just around 70 year-round residents due to harsh winds and a frigid winter climate. But during the summer months of December and January, the population booms to over a 1,000 a night between tourists and those who own summer homes.

Bea, another year-round resident, moved here 28 years ago. "It was a lost paradise truthfully, where you could live and breathe the freedom and



nature," she says. In her backyard, Bea has a *temazcal*—a sweat lodge. Here she occasionally hosts purification rituals for friends and visitors. Her garden contains a plethora of herbs and plants that she uses to make cannabis soaps, creams, oils and tinctures that she sells in town. The new Uruguayan marijuana laws make no mention of the legality of these cannabis products, so the status of her creations is ambiguous. She hopes the government will soon provide clarity.

"It's a powerful medicine that you can use in so many ways, and cannabis is a plant where you can take advantage of every part. It's not just for smoking you can use every part of the plant positively," Bea says, showing off her pot plants. "Of course it should be legal to make products with the new laws."

Another local, 58-year-old Joselo, believes Uruguay's legalization effort is "one of the best laws that's been done, that helps the entire country, the whole world... The government of Pepe did a lot of good things."

That night at the Viejo Lobo hostel, backpackers from around the world gather around a blazing bonfire. I share the final unsmoked joint from Keepz's tour with the group underneath a seemingly infinite number of stars. The next day, I return to Montevideo to meet a friend. She's curious to learn about Uruguay's cannabis culture, particularly after hearing a bit about what I'd experienced in my time here. We show up unannounced to the first cannabis club I'd visited days earlier and, to my surprise, find Keepz hanging out there. I mention that I'd finished my porros in Cabo Polonio and Keepz gifts me some more Triple Nova Unicorn.

We take our perfectly legal weed to the Plaza Independencia, outside Pepe's old office where he used to park his VW Bug. We sit on a fountain, spin up a joint and light it. There are no problems with cops or annoyed bystanders; no one seems to pay us any mind. \clubsuit

Founded in 2013 and headquartered in Edmonton at the foot of the Canadian Rockies, Aurora Cannabis Inc. looks well-poised to take a sizable chunk of the multibilliondollar legal cannabis industry both in Canada and worldwide. Spearheaded by CEO Terry Booth, the company is publicly listed (TSX: ACB) (OTCQX: ACBFF) and now has several hundred employees—an intriguing combination of business-savvy suits and cannabisobsessed cultivators and processors.

Aurora is federally licensed through the Canadian Marihuana for Medical Purposes Regulation program to grow and sell cannabis and now has four state-of-the-art facilities throughout the country. What's interesting is that its operations are new, purpose-built constructions—specifically designed and built for cannabis growing rather than repurposed existing warehouses or retrofit buildings. The layouts are designed for maximum efficiency, and their closed-loop HVAC systems allow them to produce clean and safe medical cannabis free of pesticides, molds or any microbial infections.

Aurora also has a policy of not utilizing cold pasteurization via cobalt-60 irradiation. Although some other licensed producers may use this radioactive process to sterilize their products, the team at Aurora prefers to preserve its terpenes from heat and its flowers from radioactivity in order to retain all of the medical potential of the crops. Although Aurora tests all its products in an on-site laboratory, Booth tells me, "We also have samples of all our cannabis sent to a Health Canadaqualified independent third-party laboratory for testing and analysis as well." It's important to ensure the cleanest possible product, and the team at Aurora remains devoted to maintaining the quality and integrity of its output.

LIT PRODUCTS

Aurora provides several dozen strains of flowers with high THC and CBD levels, as well as buds with a variety of THC-to-CBD ratios in five- and 10-gram increments, with all products shipped using earth-friendly cornstarch packing peanuts.

The company also sells supercritical CO₂-extracted THC and CBD drops made by blending whole-plant extract with MCT (medium-chain triglyceride) oil to attain a targeted potency. Booth explains: "MCT is a healthy, colorless, odorless oil that is found naturally in coconut oil. MCT oil is broken down easily and efficiently by the body, which means that the client receives the maximum effect of our THC and CBD drops in a relatively short time frame."

A unique product offered by Aurora, its Double-Milled Decarb capsules, is a smokefree way to receive activated cannabinoids for



patients who choose not to smoke or vaporize their flowers or oils. Flowers are decarboxylated to fully activate cannabinoids and then powdered to produce a capsule that can be eaten directly or added to food or drinks. You can buy them filled or purchase filler and capsules to make your own at home.

All of Aurora's cannabis and cannabisderived products are available at a flat-rate compassionate pricing of just \$6 per gram for patients in financial situations that qualify for the government-subsidized program established in 2013. Also available is a variety of vaporizers, including desktop versions and discreet vape pens.

Aurora's mobile app takes convenience a step further, allowing patients to view products in real time and order their cannabis medicines with a click of a button on their smartphones using fingerprint authorization. It'll even send push notifications the instant



that favored products are made available! Deliveries take between one and three business days depending on location, and the company is planning same-day delivery in the near future.

MOUNTAIN HIGH

Our first stop was in Alberta to visit and tour Aurora's 55,200-square-foot facility known as Aurora Mountain, nestled in beautiful Mountain View County near Calgary. Here, over 100 employees produce and process an astounding amount of cannabis in many different forms—over 10,000 kilograms per year! As I'm gearing up in head-to-toe protective garb to maintain sterility, chief cultivator John Barnet explains to me the protocol and process.

Plants are grown in pro-mix and drip-fed with a solution of nutrients mixed into fresh Canadian mountain water once per hour for 10 hours during the daytime light cycle. No pesticides of any kind are ever utilized, resulting in an integrated-pest-management system that relies heavily on beneficial insects. These carnivorous predators and nematodes attack any vegetarian bugs and their eggs in order to keep plants clean, healthy and thriving.

Aurora also avoids problems with powdery mildew using preventative measures that include meticulous quality control and employing strains with natural resistance to humidity-related issues. Barnet's background



in osteopathy inspires him to "treat the plants like people," and he's passionate about providing the right environment for them at all times. I quickly see that he and his crew cater to each strain's specific requirements, even with thousands of plants to maintain.

The propagation area housing mother plants and clones is lit with LEP (light-emitting plasma) and MH (metal halide) lighting. The advantages of being located in the pro-business province of Alberta include low tax rates and low electrical costs. Tissue-culture techniques are employed as well for efficiency and decontamination along with traditional cloning practices.

The 10 flowering rooms range in size from several hundred to several thousand plants. Each is maintained in ultra-sanitary conditions requiring clean trays, benches and floors. The individual enclosed rooms contain their own recycled air, with no fresh air brought in from outside.

Plants are harvested, trimmed, dried, packaged and shipped directly to patients. Climate-controlled vaults for storage contain packaging designed to protect the product from light, heat and humidity.



SKY'S THE LIMIT

Our next stop is at an enterprise the likes of which I've never seen in all my years of visiting grow facilities. Located near the international airport at Edmonton, the Dutchdesigned hybrid greenhouse known as Aurora Sky, still in the process of being built, boasts a mind-blowing 800,000 square feet! It took a helicopter ride over the site for me to truly determine the immensity of this \$100 million endeavor.

Conservatively projected to grow over 100,000 kilograms of cannabis per year, the facility employs high-tech European greenhouse agriculture technology for speed and automation. It includes a massive propagation bay, three vegetative bays that are 17,000 square feet each and 16 flowering bays that are each 35,000 square feet.

With an 8,000-plant mother room and 40,000 plants per bay, the numbers are simply mind-boggling. Add to that two massive storage vaults, multiple drying and packing rooms, space for a tissue-culture project, a hot-water storage tank and a 50-foot-deep, 102-million-gallon pond the size of 17 Olympic pools, and you begin to understand the magnitude of this endeavor.

Aurora's commitment to cost-effectiveness drove the design of the greenhouse to utilize self-cleaning antireflective glass with snowmelt technology for optimal natural-light intake. The huge hot-water tank, warmed by hyper-efficient European boilers, pumps radiant heat through tubes, and an advanced HVAC design using forced air provides uniform climate control. A separate condensation system prevents humidityrelated issues such as powdery mildew.

The bays are laid out with one lamp per every 25-26 square feet of footprint to act as supplemental lighting and help produce an even canopy over NFT (nutrient film technique) benching with one plant per square foot secured in rockwool medium. There's a 1-to-4 ratio of HPS (high-pressure sodium) to LED lights. The LEDs are sealed water-cooled units from the Dutch manufacturer Oreon, providing 53 percent more efficiency than HPS and an eight-year lifespan. Total power usage is 28 megawatts, and the facility can be seen from space! Automation is key to Aurora's good manufacturing practices, as founding cultivator Chris Mayerson explains to me: "For both quality and cost-effectiveness, we seek to have as little human contact with our plants as possible to avoid contamination. Automated bench washers clean the growing areas and cranes lift up beds to move them as necessary. Robots space out our plants, and an automatic visioning system seeks out and identifies pests and diseases. We use no pesticides at all—just bio-friendly bugs."

Aurora Sky's post-production area alone is staggering in size. Fifteen drying rooms employ a cold-harvesting method that keeps the ambient temperature no higher than 9°C (48°F). Like a giant humidor, the rooms contain only filtered air and lock in terpenes and flavonoids for optimum quality.

A team of mechanical twister machines auto-trim the flowers and send them to the packing room, which can produce 50 sealed bottles per minute accurately. Air in the containers is replaced with CO₂ and nitrogen to preserve freshness almost indefinitely.

While other licensed producers may seek to undermine and delay home-cultivation rights, Aurora sees an enticing market for personal grow equipment among the Canadian public and plans to even provide clones for sale to its customers who choose to produce their own marijuana.

CEO Booth explains: "We've always advocated for people's ability to make their own choices and are very supportive of the Supreme Court's Allard decision, which confirmed patients' rights to grow their own medical cannabis. Similarly, we believe that, after implementation of consumer legalization in Canada, individuals who choose to grow their own cannabis should have access to cultivation solutions that are in controlled environments, safe and can produce highyielding, high-quality cannabis." 



When is the right time to take a clone?

The right time to take a clone is when the plant is at least five weeks old from seeding and is growing multiple side branches and shoots. You will know by handling the plant shoots if they're older woody branches or soft tissue. Either of these can be cloned as long as you know what you are doing. The worst thing you can do is take a fresh shoot with inner walls that are still hollow—this usually ends up with the cutting wilting and becoming a soggy mess within minutes.

Clones can be removed before quickly making the final cut.



Do I need to use rooting hormone? No, you do not need to use rooting hor-

mone, as the plants naturally create growth hormones that encourage them to produce root cells and cease the growth of stem cells and leaves. You can always give your clone a supplemental hormone, which is often IAA (indole-3-acetic acid), the most naturally occurring plant hormone of the auxin variety. Some seaweed extracts also contain natural growth hormones that stimulate root-cell development.

What is the best medium in which to root my clones?

You can buy a range of different rooting cubes and jiffy plugs these days. The smaller cube-size versions allow roots to become air-pruned as they grow out of the medium and begin their expansion. Using coco or peat-moss jiffy plugs, Root Riot foam cubes or rockwool cubes will allow you to root successfully while maintaining the proper moisture level. My personal favorite for rooting clones are 2-inch-square coco jiffy cubes.



What temperature is best for my clones?

The temperature and humidity of your cloning area needs to be warm and wet. This is the main reason why growers experience stunted clones or rooting that can take anywhere from 21 to 35 days. If your growroom temperature is below 68°F, your clones will avoid rooting. Maintain a humidity level of 70% and a temperature of 75°F.

Why is there is fuzzy mold growing inside the propagator?

If you've left your humidity dome for several days untouched, you may notice that stagnant air and wet conditions have caused your clones to grow a furry white fungus. When you touch the plant material, it will feel soggy or mushy. This is a major setback, especially if you are depending on growing out a certain number of plants. To remediate this, remove the lid, immediately dispose of the infected clones and introduce fresh air into the propagator. You should lift the lid for 30 seconds daily to encourage the exchange of fresh air, taking care to maintain proper temperature and humidity. Cutting a quarter-size hole into the clear plastic at either end of the lid can help circulate air as well.

How big does my propagator need to be?

From my experience, the bigger the propagator, the better it is for the clones. You can easily root cones in cups and cover them with cling-wrap film and an elastic band if you must; however, using a propagator that is 12 inches tall provides plenty of room to take larger, more mature clones. Avoid using a small propagator that is 6 inches tall or less, as you'll only end up with cramped clones touching the wet sides and roof of the plastic dome.

Why does my clone have white bumps around its base?

This is the process whereby a cutting produces root cells. These first nubs are the earliest indicators that your clone is developing roots. At this stage, the clone is becoming an established, independent plant, so don't disturb these delicate primordia. After it forms a fully developed root system with fibrous root hairs, the clone will independently photosynthesize and begin taking in nutrients and growing.

When will my clones start showing roots?

This is determined by a number of variables including temperature, humidity, lighting and the overall quality of the plant. As long as your cloning room is at a humidity level of 70% and the room temperature is 75°F, you should see the first roots emerging within 7-10 days. If you are using larger clones, they will root first due to their size and maturity.





Does it matter which part of the mother plant a clone is taken from?

Many growers swear that clones taken from the base of a plant will root first, perhaps because they were closest to the mother plant's roots. Other growers testify that cloning from the top using the mother plant's newest growth will produce the fastest-rooting clones. Cloning cannabis is a game of patience, and trying to rush the process will only frustrate you further. As long as the cuttings you take have at least one internode and some leaves, you'll have success.

Why are my rooted clones starting to wilt after taking them out of the humidity dome?

This is called the hardening-off process. Your clones have been acclimated to warm and wet conditions and now need to get used to life outside of the humidity dome. It will not take long for them to adjust, just like a fish that's been transferred into a tank of fresh water. If your clones are wilting and look like they're about to die, improper temperature or humidity is to blame. You must remember that you're mimicking the spring season. Slowly introduce them into their new environment that contains intense lighting and wind from fans.

Can I transplant the rooted clones to any grow medium now?

Once your clones are hardened off and you are happy with the way they are coming along, you should prepare the grow medium into which they'll establish themselves and grow. The roots of the clone will want to dig down as far as they can to anchor themselves firmly into the medium. Feed them very lightly at this stage and encourage more dry periods to avoid having a waterlogged medium. Roots will push out aggressively when they're looking for moisture and available nutrients.

Is there any other way to root clones?

If you find that the conventional technique isn't working, you can look at other cloning methods, such as using a bubbler or air layering. Using a bubbler entails sitting freshly cut clones in a bubbling oxygenated nutrient solution with a water temperature of 75°F. Air layering is used in bonsai-tree production and can result in some large and sturdy foot-long clones when done correctly. It's something I personally do when I want to take a large side branch and grow it as an independent clone. The amazing thing is that it's actually performed on the plant as it's growing normally. I strongly recommend you research this technique before attempting it, especially if you are new to plant biology.

Do I really need to cut the leaf blades down?

You do not need to remove any of the leaf blades, but it does encourage the plant to cease photosynthesis and almost shut down. This is how root cells are able to form in the dark, wet conditions of the rooting cube. Many growers simply cut a healthy clone and then, once it has rooted, allow it to grow with all its leaves intact.

It's been 14 days and still no roots. Am I doing something wrong?

Most likely you've messed up one of the basics and now your pristine clones are back to square one. If you remove the clone and look at it closely, you may see that there's no root development. In fact, there might be just a soggy decaying tip where a healthy wooden stem once sat. If this is the case, then learn from your mistake and apply root hormone, change to a fresh new medium and make sure your temperature and humidity are at the proper levels.

How many clones can I take off a mother plant before it's excessive? It may be called the mother plant, but she needs nurturing too. You should care for the mother plant and raise her to produce as many healthy clones while also pruning her to fit in your space. You shouldn't take too many clones at once, as you will eventually be left with a large woody stem with few shoots remaining. You also should consider using a new mother plant after multiple generations of cloning have taken place.

What are the top tips for cloning?

One of my personal favorite techniques is to double dip. This involves taking a clone and wetting the bottom inch with water, then dipping the wet part of the cutting in rooting-hormone powder. Once the powder has fully stuck to the wet part, you can now dip it into a rooting gel to seal that rooting powder in and provide a double dose of natural growth hormone.

Good luck getting 100% success rates on your clones and becoming the farmer you've always wanted to be! *****







ACKIE MARTLING MAKES A LIVING AS A COMEDIAN, BUT HE'S NOT MUCH OF A FAN OF COMEDY. MARTLING LIKES JOKES—THE DIRTIER THE BETTER—BECAUSE HIS GOAL IS TO ELICIT A VISCERAL REACTION THAT HE LIKENS TO A GUT PUNCH. HE'S BEEN HONING HIS CRAFT FOR NEARLY 40 YEARS, 18 OF WHICH WERE SPENT AS THE HEAD WRITER FOR *THE HOWARD STERN SHOW*, AND HIS REPERTOIRE IS AWE-INSPIRING. HIS "STUMP THE JOKE MAN" BIT, IN WHICH HE'S GIVEN THE SETUP OF A JOKE AND INEVITABLY KNOWS THE PUNCHLINE FROM MEMORY, IS A REMARKABLE FEAT TO WITNESS. NOW IN HIS 70S, MARTLING IS A LONGTIME SUPPORTER OF CANNABIS, WHICH ASSISTED HIM IN QUITTING ALCOHOL IN THE WAKE OF HIS DEPARTURE FROM THE STERN SHOW IN 2001. SEVENTEEN YEARS LATER, MARTLING CONTINUES TOURING THE COUNTRY AS A STAND-UP AND ADDING JOKES TO HIS IMPRESSIVE REPERTOIRE. WE CAUGHT UP WITH HIM IN BETWEEN GIGS IN NEW YORK CITY.

When did you first know you were a comedian?

Funny you should ask that. To this day, any time I'm telling someone I'm a comedian, I fully expect a tap on the shoulder and then to hear in my ear, "Oh no, you're not." Hey, I'm insecure now, but how long can it last? Actually, I'm not a comedian, I'm a joke teller. The first big laugh I got was with a not-quite-off-color joke I told while emceeing the East Norwich, Long Island, Cub Scout Pack 253 Blue & Gold Dinner in 1958 at age 10. And I was relatively sober.

You're known for your encyclopedic knowledge of jokes. How did you develop that?


I realized when I was very young how much I enjoyed telling and hearing jokes. I bought joke books and voraciously read anything with jokes in it. But mainly I listened and then listened some more. It seems like the jokes stuck in my head from the onset.

Eventually I was the last guy standing—and drinking—at every bar, party, you name it. I tell a joke, you tell a joke, I tell three jokes, someone else tells a joke, I tell seven jokes... I wasn't out to accomplish anything, there was no Machiavellian plan, I just like jokes.

I graduated from Michigan State University as a mechanical engineer in 1971 and used my diploma to roll pot. Getting a regular job was so out of the question, I can't remember ever even having any conversations about that concept with myself, let alone anybody else, *ever*.

I never set out to be a comedian. But in January 1979, I transitioned from performing as a guitar player who told jokes to a comedian who played the guitar. And it worked from day one. I never looked back.

I realize that was a very long-winded answer. But the devil's in the details. If you

think you'd enjoy reading my full story, please close this magazine and go buy my book, *The Joke Man: Bow to Stern. High Times* won't mind, because you already bought or stole their magazine.

What is it about jokes that appeals to you, as opposed to the conversational style of stand-up?

For the most part, jokes regular "a crocodile and a rabbi go into a bar" jokes, with very specific punchlines—get bigger and more explosive laughs. And that's what I've been in it for from the start: laughs. I had no aspiration to be a comedian didn't want to tell people about my life—I just wanted to make them laugh as hard as I could. So often somebody will say, "Why dirty jokes?" Because that's what gets guffaws and screams. Laughter comes from the release of tension, and sex or poop simply introduce much more tension than complaining about airplane food.

Johnny Carson would do a seven-minute monologue, telling jokes about the weather, the president, current events, and then at the end he'd occasionally tell a very borderline dick joke, and the entire audience would *lose* it. Human nature.

When I'm standing there telling you a joke, the best possible outcome for me is you reacting like I just punched you in the stomach. Really.

For example: The marriage counselor says, "I think we should begin with something you have in common." The husband says, "Neither of us likes to suck cock."

Does pot play a role in your joke writing? Is it any part of your creative process?

Pot has never had any role in my comedy. I only went onstage stoned once—as a comedian—and never did it again. It does, however, have a role in everything else I do.

The weed these days is a bit more potent than it was when I first imbibed back in the late '60s. I sat on the bus with Willie Nelson last week, and he hands me his electronic pipe and it was Willie's Reserve and I had a hit, two hits. Then we went out-Willie had a sold-out show at the House of Blues-and [my friend and I are] in the back corner... It was pleasant as hell, but I was out of my mind from two hits. And I'm saying, we're here and he's onstage, but the three of us are sharing a head.

Yeah, he's a trooper. He'll play for hours.

I love him.

When did you get into cannabis?

I smoked my first joint in 1967, sophomore year of college, listening to Surrealistic Pillow, an LP by a great new group, Jefferson Airplane. When I tell people I never smoked pot until I got to college, they can't believe it. But back then, it wasn't, how old were you when you first got high? It was more like, where were you in 1967? Because, to a lot of us baby boomers, pot was like the VCR and the computer-one minute it didn't exist, and then it was everywhere.

From the onset, I was the guy on the *Stern* show promoting weed. And I've always let it be known how proud I am to be associated with *High Times*.

There've been times in my life where I stopped smoking pot for a day, a week, a year... just because things come and go and supply and demand. I was never a wake-and-bake guy, but I really enjoy pot. And it's not doing anybody any harm. We all know that.



THE HIGH TIMES INTERVIEW



I DID A SHOW IN DENVER, AND THIS GUY CAME TO THE SHOW AND HE GAVE ME SOMETHING I'D NEVER SEEN BEFORE. HE GAVE ME A BIG SLAB OF HASH BUT IT WAS GREEN. AND HE SAID IT WAS CALLED KIEF? HOLY CHRIST... YOU PUT A LITTLE SPRINKLE OF THAT ON ANYTHING AND YOU GO TO THE MOON.

You travel all over the country doing comedy. Who do you think has the best pot?

The truth about that is, I come into a town and do a show, so it depends on who ends up being my connection that night. There's always people in town that want to have the best pot—and they're the people that come up to me and say, "Try this, Joke Man!" And you never know. I can be in the middle of nowhere and some little old lady will come up and hand me a joint, and I'll smoke it and I won't be able to move.

For the most part, I've always been handed great stuff. I did a show in Denver, and this guy came to the show and he gave me something I'd never seen before. He gave me a big slab of hash but it was green. And he said it was called kief? Holy Christ. And I flew home with it—I don't know how. But you put a little sprinkle of that on anything and you go to the moon.

Who were your favorite comedians growing up?

I loved Red Skelton because he enjoyed himself so damn much. My mother used

to say she loved to watch me watch *The Red Skelton Show*. Red has to be at least partly responsible for me incessantly laughing during my act. There's two things you don't do if you're a comedian: You don't tell old jokes, and you don't laugh at your own jokes. That's *all* I do.

I also loved Redd Foxx, Henny Youngman, Rodney Dangerfield... the joke guys. Not to beat it to death any more than I have, but I'm a joke fan, as opposed to a comedy fan.

Who do you admire most now?

As far as the comics nowadays, I think maybe I'm not as tuned-in as I should be. The guy I like the most is Chris Rock.

How'd you get involved with *The Howard Stern Show*?

The short version is on someone's suggestion I sent my comedy albums to Howard, he liked them and he called and invited me to sit in on the show in February 1983. And I stayed for eighteen years.

The long version is one of the best chapters in my book, *The Joke Man: Bow to Stern*.

You were with Howard for almost two decades, so I'm sure there's a lot to pick from. But could you tell us about your favorite Stern experience?

I've of course been asked this a zillion times, and to this day I have no answer. All those years of passing Howard a line and 10 seconds later millions of people laughing out loud at what you just wrote sets a pretty high bar for peripheral stuff to make a dent.

The Madison Square Garden premiere of *Private Parts* is way up there, not to mention three days on a film set. I still have trouble wrapping my mind around the fact that we broadcast live from Abbey Road Studios for a week. And of course, beating *Saturday Night Live* in the ratings was surreal.

Toward the end of your time with Stern, a lot was made of your use of alcohol. How bad was it and how did you overcome it?

My drinking had never really escalated—ever since high school it had been fairly heavy. But I never missed the show because of it. Mainly it had just been going on way too long. So after I left the show in 2001, knowing I'd have a lot of free time and could easily disappear into the abyss, I stopped. People tell me, "Oh, you're not sober because you still smoke pot." And I'm like, "Go screw yourself."

The show had a field day with my thirst. But truth be told, if anybody ever drank as much as they claimed I did, they'd be in a jar somewhere.

In the '70s, you set up a phone line where people could call in and get a joke. Now, four decades later, you're using Twitter in a similar way, providing jokes daily at 4:20.

My joke line—"Use Your Finger! (516) 922-WINE!"—is

coming up on 40 uninterrupted years. Call it right now!

Yeah, nowadays in addition to the phone line, I tweet jokes every day at 4:20 p.m., which I'm sure I don't have to tell your readers is International Marijuana Time. Please follow me on Twitter, @ JackieMartling.

But I started the joke line in January 1979 to promote the very first Long Island comedy shows that were produced by me and Richie Minervini. The tales of my dial-a-joke are endless and are well-documented in my book. [*Laughs*]


Please, tell us about your book.


If you insist. I'd been working on my autobiography for decades. I had enough stories to fill two books, so beware the sequel.

I let it all hang out, where I started, how I wound up with Howard, what we did and then what happened at the end. I wanted to get my version out there, you know? It's roughly one-third about my pre-radio-show life and comedy, and the remaining two-thirds document the direct trail to Howard and much of the wonderful stuff that ensued.

Each chapter title starts with a year, so it's a timeline of all of our lives—"1997: Paying Rodney With Jokes"... Everyone tells me that whenever they're reading the book they trip off into their own lives. To order the book, just go to *jackiethejokeman.com*.

SUBJECT: **Female Pre-Flowers** FROM: **Vasco De Ganja**


How can I tell what the sex of my plant will be before the flowering stage has begun?

Dear Vasco,

You need to examine the node where the leaves meet the stems and look for the preflowers. Male pre-flowers look like tiny spikes with balls on the end, and female pre-flowers look like tiny teardropshaped pods with white hairs sticking out.



Danko Tip: Use a light meter to measure whether you're getting the minimum 6,000 lumens per square foot at the canopy level.



SUBJECT: **Praying Mantis** FROM: **Bugging Out in Butte**

A friend of mine told me that having a praying mantis in the growroom can help kill harmful bugs. Is this true?

Dear BOB,

Indeed, carnivorous praying mantises (or mantids) love to eat many of the insects that plague our ganja gardens, and they are one of nature's most voracious garden protectors and a great organic alternative to chemical pesticides. Pests like aphids, white flies, and spider mites and their eggs make hearty meals for these predators. You can purchase mantis eggs online and have them delivered as pods containing up to 150 or more babies that will eventually hatch in warm weather or in your warm growroom. Once they've eaten their fill, they'll want more food, so you'll need to either feed them more bugs or send them on their way. It's quite fun to watch them attack the vegetarian pests!

UBJECT: **Two Plants, One Pot** FROM: **CG**

I'm a beginner grower and I stupidly put two plants too close together in a midsize pot. I knew it was time to transfer them to a larger pot, and when I did so the roots were tangled. I tried to untangle them without harming them, but it just couldn't be done. I knew that if I kept on messing with them I would make them really sick. They are now slightly in shock, but they don't seem to be goners yet. Anyways, is it okay that the roots are tangled? Also, what can I do to bring them back up to health? I appreciate your time, man.

Dear CG,

Planting more than one cannabis plant in the same container is ill-advised and less than ideal. As you mentioned, the roots become tangled, and they will also compete for nutrients in your medium while the plants up top will also compete for light. This will result in significantly smaller yields than if the plants were in their own pots and not crowded together. At this point, I wouldn't recommend separating them due to the stress that it can inevitably cause. Chalk it up to a lesson learned and remember in the future to "keep 'em separated."

SUBJECT: **Drain to Waste** FROM: **David H.**


Ve been growing hydroponically using a flood-and-drain system for some time and would love to see some info on drainto-waste systems. Are they more or less efficient? What are the reasons that some growers choose to run nutrients through only once?

Dear David,

Hydroponic systems can either utilize the recirculation of nutrient solution, such as in your flood-and-drain unit, or drain to waste for watering purposes. The difference is that the first method waters your roots over and over with the same liquid, and the second method only uses the liquid once before it's discarded. Both techniques each have their own benefits as well as some drawbacks.

Recirculating systems such as the flood-and-drain method you've been using simplify the watering process by reusing nutrient solution over and over for 1 to 2 weeks before being replaced. The pH level and the amount of nutrients (parts-per-million, or PPM) will vary and change as the plants use up water and food. Reservoirs must be replenished with fresh water and nutrients and be monitored at all times for variations in conditions.

The advantage of using a drain-towaste system is that it prevents the spread of diseases, pathogens and root rot, and it negates the typical pH fluctuations of recirculating hydroponic systems. Drain-to-waste systems work best in gardens with a few plants in large containers rather than in gardens with many smaller plants bunched together. Even though it sounds like it's inefficient (partly because of the word "waste" in its



name), this type of system can actually end up costing less due to the level of control the grower has over the feeding process. If you use only a little more than the plants need, the actual "waste" is minimal in a well-dialed-in system.



SUBJECT: Harvest Time

FROM: Zach's Dad

I have a plant that's about 2 feet tall. It started flowering early for some reason, but it's budding beautifully at this point. It's been raised strictly outside and it's my first time trying to grow anything. My question is: How will I know when it's the right time to harvest? Right now, there are about 25-30% red hairs. Is it too soon?

Dear ZD,


The amount or percentage of red hairs is not an accurate way to judge the proper time to harvest your plants. The best thing you can do is to get a magnification device such as a loupe or microscope that will give you a closer look at the actual trichomes on your buds.

Typically referred to as "crystals," trichomes are actually glands filled with essential oils made up of cannabinoids such as THC, CBD and CBN, as well as flavinoids and terpenes. They look a little bit like clear little mushrooms with a stalk and a bulbous head. These gland heads can be separated and pressed together to make hashish.

As harvest time approaches, the gland heads will turn from clear to cloudy white, and then eventually amber as they begin to mature beyond ripeness. If you harvest when some of the gland heads are still clear, you'll get a more uplifting high. If you wait until most are amber, the effects will be more lethargic. It really comes down to personal preference, but most people prefer them when they're cloudy—that's when the THC levels are at their highest with no degradation.

I have a question about breeding cannabis. Does the term "hybrid vigor" imply that we've bred out this strength from repeated backcrossing and the resulting loss of the second gene copy? I believe this is like the concept of "purebred" dogs, in that to get a true breeding strain you must cleave off the second copy by breeding back to a parent.

Danko Tip: Dead leaves and plant debris on floors are a breeding ground for pests. Keep all growroom surfaces clean at all times.

Dear Coinspinner,

Hybrid vigor is the result of crossing two unlike strains, such as a *sativa* from Africa and an *indica* from India. Also referred to as the "F1 cross," the seeds from this pairing will perform with more gusto than either of their parents. The F2 and further crosses will not result in hybrid vigor—only the first filial generation will benefit from the vitality and strength of growth produced. The best seed breeders sell F1 crosses with hybrid vigor as these make the best mother plants for future clone gardens.

Growers wishing to take advantage of hybrid vigor on their own would benefit from reading up on breeding theory, terms and techniques. Two great books to begin with are Robert Connell Clarke's *Marijuana Botany: An Advanced Study: The Propagation and Breeding of Distinctive Cannabis* and Greg Green's *The Cannabis Breeder's Bible: The Definitive Guide to Marijuana Genetics, Cannabis Botany and Creating Strains for the Seed Market.*

The second breeding technique you're referring to is called back-crossing, wherein a particular strain is "crossed back" to its parent or even its grandparents. This is done in order to stabilize genetics when you're growing out large populations and choosing wisely for desirable traits. Each subsequent generation should be more and more consistent in producing plants with the qualities you desire whether they are potency, flavor, odor, yield or bud structure.

SUBJECT: Light Leaks

I have a closet grow box and two of my plants turned hermaphrodite on me. I asked some people and they all told me that light somehow must have gotten into my box. I believe them because the two plants affected were closest to the door. My question is: If such a small amount of light can do this to a closet grow, how do people keep their outdoor plants from turning hermaphrodite when there's a full moon or bright stars? I'm going to grow a couple plants outside and would like to know if I need to cover them at night!

Dear Jordan,

It is true that light leaks can cause female plants to become hermaphrodites and exhibit male flowers, potentially seeding your whole crop with practically useless beans instead of sinsemilla ("without seeds" in Spanish) buds. If the plants receive strong light during their "night" cycle, when the lights are supposed to be off, they react with shock and the resulting stress can manifest itself in hermaphroditic tendencies. A small amount of dim light is usually insufficient to cause this reaction and it tends to happen more often when bright light interrupts the dark cycle.

Outdoors, the natural night cycle includes light from the moon and bright stars that does not affect the plants because they're not bright or shocking enough by themselves. Only a street light or motion-detector light could really disrupt the outdoor dark cycle, as plants are accustomed to withstand small and dull amounts of natural outdoor light throughout the night. Avoid planting near artificial sources of light, but don't worry about the naturally occurring glow of the moon and stars. $\frac{1}{2}$





INGREDIENTS

15 frozen phyllo cups 7 oz. Brie cheese (you'll have some left over) 4 tbsp. cannabis-infused butter, unsalted and melted 2½ tbsp. store-bought ginger-mango chutney Chopped fresh parsley for garnishing

DIRECTIONS

Preheat oven to 425°F and arrange the phyllo cups on a baking sheet. Fill each cup with a small chunk of Brie that's big enough to fit the cup, about a half-inch cube. The rind is completely edible, so there is no need to cut it off. Bake four to five minutes, just until the cheese is melted. Brush a little butter inside of each cheesefilled cup.

Add half a teaspoon of chutney to the top of each cup, then sprinkle with some parsley. These taste great served warm or at room temperature.



OLORADO LAWMAKERS ARE well into their fifth legislative session since enacting the retail sale of adult-use marijuana in 2012, and the need to coordinate the various policy discussions around the issue has never been greater. Since Colorado voters approved recreational cannabis, there have been ongoing debates surrounding various aspects of the law and its impact-such as how best to address the question of social consumption, product testing and the use of medical cannabis on public campuses. To best address these issues, state lawmakers have formed the first-ever statewide Cannabis Caucus.

Modeled off of the success that we have seen in the establishment of the federal Congressional Cannabis Caucus, it was imperative to create avenues for policy to be discussed and developed at the state level with consumers in mind.

At the federal level, with the support of NORML and other allies, what used to be a few lawmakers and their staffers having passing conversations and the occasional private meeting to discuss cannabis policy is now a robust group that holds regular briefings exploring the issues most adversely affecting individuals. In the first three months of

2018, there have been six meetings or policy briefings on Capitol Hill regarding pending efforts to end prohibition and address collateral consequences such as employment rights, veterans' health care and fair hiring practices.

With the end of marijuana prohibition and the implementation of a robust tax-and-regulate program in Colorado, it's imperative to consider the various areas of public policy that have been affected and how they interact with consumers and constituents. From job creation and law-enforcement priorities to public education and health care, Colorado's newly formed Cannabis Caucus will help facilitate discussions among lawmakers regarding how best to address these important matters.

How did this happen? Well, we asked for it.

I personally became involved, floating

the idea to several Colorado lawmakers over the last year. However, it wasn't until I met with State Representative Dan Pabon's office that things started to take shape. From there, Representative Pabon's staffers facilitated internal conversations among lawmakers about the possibility of establishing the new caucus, and Denver NORML and I focused our time on recruiting new members and providing educational materials.

By creating a formalized structure, we knew it would make it easier for constituents and advocates to leverage our influence in a much more constructive way. By streamlining a system where we can present policy ideas to address existing problems, as well as having many lawmakers engaged at once, it would make the burden of persuasion that much lighter.

For the first meeting of Colorado's newly formed Cannabis Caucus, the focus was on a variety of issues, including leadership of the new caucus; Colorado's thriving marijuana industry; the many policy discussions around taxation, regulation and enforcement; and the ongoing need for consumer advocacy.

We at NORML understand the need for state-level elected leaders to create incubators for thoughtful debate and policy discussions. That's why we're pleased to support the first action taken by Colorado's Cannabis Caucus: a letter addressed to members of Colorado's congressional delegation urging legislative action to prevent US Attorney General Jeff Sessions from interfering with statesanctioned marijuana programs. The effort attracted the support of 33 Democratic members of Colorado's General Assembly.

We already have a number of state legislatures throughout the nation looking to follow Colorado's lead and establish their own working groups. Through this process, we are taking yet another crucial step in building the foundation to responsibly end prohibition in a fashion that will smoothly translate in a pro-consumer and pro-civil-liberties manner.

Over the last few years, we have seen an unprecedented push towards greater legalization of cannabis in a number of key markets, most notably in the U.S. and Canada. Unlike Canadian markets, pushed forward through federal support, U.S. legalization efforts have been driven by state legislation. This has led to a worry that the legal cannabis industry is in a "wild west" phase, crying out for greater regulation and enforcement.

Despite strong public support and a powerful movement of entrepreneurs and activists in key states like California and

public. For cannabis to fully integrate into the mainstream of American life, clearer rules and stronger enforcement surely will be necessary. In particular, this will likely be a key part of the inevitable federal legalization of cannabis. State governments from both sides of the political spectrum in the United States are leaning consistently in favor of greater cannabis legalization. This is a common theme from both Americans concerned with freedom from government control, to Americans concerned about unevenlyenforced drug laws that unfairly target minorities.

This consensus is steadily increasing day-by-day, but the final hurdle will involve skeptics concerned about public health and child safety.

In order to satisfy the demands of a concerned public that represents a large portion of the American population, it is inevitable that cannabis will see greater enforcement. This includes a long list of possible regulations. An example could be a law restricting dispensaries from operating within a given distance of a school or daycare. Or a law capping the total volume of cannabis a customer can buy in a given timeframe.

Businesses currently operating legally at the state level need to be ready for a shift in cannabis regulation. So far, the Federal Government has stayed largely outside of legal cannabis at the state level, but there has never been a clear sign this would be the case forever. Should the Federal Government take a strong stance on cannabis, companies need to be ready to meet the scrutiny and necessary commitments that likely would be needed.

Companies already operating at a level of compliance and transparency are on the right track to ensuring their practices will fall in line with any eventual mandate set out by the Federal Government to regulate the cultivation, sale and distribution of cannabis.

Industry actors like Alternate Health Corp. (OTCQB:AHGIF) recognize this need to be prepared and are building compliance and transparency directly into their products and services. Companies also need to be prepared as governments and political parties change and electoral whims get passed into law. They need to recognize that regulators will have a wide range of flexibility on how they choose to enforce their mandate.

Therefore, cannabis companies need to prepare for government changes and protect themselves from risks in the future. And for investors, the key to longevity will be embracing the regulations of the marketplace.

The shift to legalized medicinal and recreational marijuana is underway in many states and this process is opening up new opportunities in regulation and compliance. Public concerns about age verification, child-proof packaging and impaired driving in particular are capturing the attention of businesses and the public alike.

Although the issue of impaired driving is nothing new, legal cannabis is pushing this debate to the forefront of the public conversation. More attention has been placed on how to monitor, test and control cannabis to ensure no one operates a vehicle under the influence.

Concepts affiliated with controlled substance legislation, like road side testing, childproof packaging, and age verification already have obvious precedents in other markets.

Alcohol, tobacco and prescription medications have long-established guidelines and regulations in place.

are looking at cannabis as a serious career path where they can build the next solution. I see rising trends in cannabis-infused feminine products. Women in general are interested to learn how such products could support needs from chronic pain to intimacy accessories. Like many medications, a child-proof container for cannabis is another step towards safety. However, there are other considerations to be taken into account
